



IAU COMPETITION RULES FIELD CROSSBOW 2005

Art. 304 RIGHTS OF PARTICIPATION AND CITIZENSHIP

304.1 Only teams and individuals who belong to a Federation which is a member of the IAU and which has fulfilled all its obligations to the IAU shall participate in IAU sanctioned events.

304.2 **Eligibility:** To be eligible to participate as a Member of a National Team in IAU sanctioned events, an archer must have in his possession a valid passport from the country of which he is a National Team Member; or if he is to be a Member of another National Team he must have resided in the new country for at least one year and must have the written permission of the member federation, if any, of the country from which he has a valid passport. Nationals of the host federation who do not have a valid passport, must provide alternative proof of Citizenship or Residency to the satisfaction of the TC.

304.2.1 **Amateur Status:** An official declaration of amateur status to accord with the provisions of the International Olympic Committee (IOC) for each participating archer will be required to be lodged with the OC in a format approved by the TC Chairman.

Team officials participating in the Championships must abide by these Rules.

304.2.2 **Standards:** At WC, only competitors who have attained the following average standards for the Single IR 900 Round shall participate:

Men	770 points
Women	740 points
Juniors	740 points
Cadets	730 points

At Indoor WC only competitors who have attained the following average standards for the single IR 300 round shall participate.

Men	280 points
Women	275 points
Junior	275 points
Cadets	270 points

304.3 **Guest Competitors :** At WC and RC, only competitors from Countries that are not yet members of the IAU may be invited to participate as Guests. Such invitations can only be made by the IAU Executive Committee Guest competitors may be individuals or complete teams and are eligible for special awards.

The Participation of a Guest competitor shall not disadvantage the bona-fide IAU Member Federations whose competitors shall take priority with regard to target availability.

All Guest competitors shall be assessed for competency, safety and knowledge of these rules to the satisfaction of the IAU Field TC.
