Art. 308 INTERNATIONAL COMPETITION, TITLES AND AWARDS

308.1 **Team Competition:** The team with the highest aggregate score for a Double **IR 900** shot one single round per consecutive day will be acclaimed:

At **WC:** World Champion Team
At **RC:** Regional Champion Team

308.2 **Individual Competition:** The competitors (Men/Women/Juniors/**Cadets**) with the highest aggregate scores for a Double IR 900 round or any Indoor shot one single round per consecutive day plus the finals event will be acclaimed:

At **WTC:** World Champion (Man/Woman/Junior/**Cadet**)
At **RTC:** Regional Champion (Man/Woman/Junior/**Cadet**)
See Finals Rules Art. 350.

308.2.1 **Junior and Cadet Competition:** Competitors in the under 18 age group shall be classed as **Cadets**. Competitors shall be eligible for such awards provided that they have **NOT** attained the age of 18 years on the first Competition day. A federation may select competitors in the under 18 age group to compete in the Juniors, Men's or Women's divisions, but not in the Seniors division (Art .308.2.2).

Competitors in the under 21 age group shall be classed as **Juniors**. Competitors shall be eligible for such awards provided that they have **NOT** attained the age of 21 years on the first Competition day. A federation may select competitors in the under 21 age group to compete in the Men's or Women's divisions, but not in the Cadets or Seniors division (Art. 308.2.2).

All Cadets and Juniors must submit proof of age at time of Competition registration. There shall be no distinction between males and females.

308.2.2 **Senior Competition:** As from 1st January 1998, at **WC, RC, IC** or **CE** an Organising Committee may announce a Competition for Individual Seniors on the written invitations. Such announcement must clearly state that the Senior Competition is without title (not a World or Continental Championship). **Entries for the Senior Competition must be endorsed by the National Federation concerned.**

Competitors having attained the age of fifty five (55) on or before the first day of the Competition can be classed as Seniors. All Seniors must submit proof of age at the time of Competition registration. There shall be no distinction between males and females.

308.3 **Medals:** At **WC**, and **RC** the following awards shall be presented in accordance with Arts. 308.1 and 308.2:

Gold Medals: Shall be awarded to the individual Man, Woman, Junior and Senior and also for the Men's Team, Women's Team, Juniors Team (Art. 303.2) achieving the highest score.

Silver Medals: Shall be awarded to the individual Man, Woman, Junior and Senior and also for the Men's Team, Women's Team, Juniors Team (Art. 303.2) achieving the second highest score.

Bronze Medals: Shall be awarded to the individual Man, Woman and Junior and also for the Men's Team, Women's Team and Juniors Team (Art. 303.2) achieving the third highest score.

308.4 **Participation Awards:** All Competitors and officials shall be presented with a Participation Award to signify their participation in a particular IAU sanctioned Competition. Such awards may bear the emblem of the IAU, host organisation and/or Competition logo. The presentation of participation awards restricted to competitors, judges and IAU officials in attendance. Members of the OC, Scorers and field parties may also receive these awards at the discretion of the OC.

308.5 Individual WC and RC medals shall be supplied by the IAU for all categories The IAU EC will contribute 50% of the cost, the remaining 50% being paid by the OC.

The cost of team awards, special prizes for the winners of each category and participation medals shall be borne by the OC.
